PRINCETON YMCA AND PRINCETON YOUNG ACHIEVERS HOST CELEBRATION CONCERT WITH PRINCETON’S OWN MINISTER WILLIAM D. CARTER, III

PRINCETON, October 4 - To celebrate the joining together of two organizations dedicated to youth development and education, the Princeton Family YMCA and the Princeton Young Achievers will host a celebration concert with Princeton’s own Minister William D. Carter, III on Sunday afternoon, October 23 in the YMCA-YWCA’s All Purpose Room. The event, chaired by Gail Olivia Everett of Princeton, will begin at 4:00 PM with light refreshments with the concert at 4:30 PM. Tickets are \$12 and proceeds will be used to support Princeton Young Achievers’ three afterschool learning centers.

Minister Carter’s performance will offer a variety of musical selections from the Gospel, Classical and Contemporary music traditions. As the Minister of Music at the First Baptist Church of Princeton, Carter’s career reflects a lifelong commitment to his music and faith. A graduate of the Philadelphia High School for the Creative and Performing Arts, he also studied at the University of the Arts and is currently a student at Eastern University majoring in Organizational Leadership. Minister Carter has appeared with Peter Nero & the Philly Pops, the renowned male ensemble, Three2Five, and most recently, the Princeton University’s Gospel Ensemble as the featured pianist and soloist. He has also shared the stage with several gospel recording artists including Richard Smallwood, Tye Tribbett and Dorothy Norwood. He is accredited with his first single CD, “Gonna Give Thanks to God” and his latest CD, “All to Him.”

Joining Minister Carter will be Gabe Greenwood, 14, an eighth-grade student at John Witherspoon Middle School. Gabe has written songs and raps, appeared in two operas at McCarter Theatre, performed at Carnegie Hall, the Kimmel Center, and Tanglewood with the American Boychoir School, and as a soloist for services at the First Baptist Church of Princeton. Gabe has been a finalist for the last two Freehold Idol competitions. He enjoys playing table tennis, playing drums, learning about history, and watching soccer, and hopes to be either a professional singer or a screenwriter.
